

# **HISTORIC, ARCHITECTURAL, AND CULTURAL RESOURCES INVENTORY**

### **1.0.0 SUMMARY**

To further a goal in the Town's Comprehensive Plan, a project team was organized to undertake an inventory of historical, architectural, and other cultural resources within the Town of Cazenovia. The focus was to be those that potentially could be deemed "significant" as defined by the State and/or as recognized by the community. As such, the project represents a discovery phase to identify such resources and to determine whether consideration should be given to further identify, recognize, and protect such resources. This report documents the findings, and analyzes the feasibility and requirements of implementing a process to achieve those objectives.

The conclusions drawn from this phase are overwhelmingly positive. The Town of Cazenovia represents a rich and diverse pool of buildings and structures that can be associated with the broad patterns of Cazenovia's history; as well as those which embody distinctive characteristics of an architectural period or method of construction. Of the roughly 1729 properties in the Town (which also may include barns and secondary structures), 753 properties became subject to review. Of these 404 are recommended as warranting designation following further research and documentation.

The resources fell predominantly into three categories: Those of architectural significance and integrity; those of historical significance only; and some sharing both attributes. Among the individual properties are potentially also several districts -- collective groups of resources that possess a significant concentration or continuity of sites, buildings, and structures, that are united historically or aesthetically.

In the course of the project, opportunities to leverage this asset into economic development, education, and Town development planning became apparent. While analysis of such opportunities is outside of the scope of this project, a list is provided in the report.

The team recommends that the Town:

- Undertake additional phases of analysis of the inventory with the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) to: validate recommended properties; identify and prioritize in-depth research on recommended resources; identify recognition and protection programs; and, to identify candidates for Register nominations by property owners (first phase: February – May 2011).
- Engage with the SHPO to draft ordinances relating to the protection of architecturally significant resources and/or historically significant resources (May – October 2011).
- Concurrently, work with the SHPO to complete all requirements necessary to become a Certified Local Government (March – November 2011).

- Apply for an intern in 2012 to assist in the research and documentation phases (2011 Applications are due February 11, 2011).
- Further identify and undertake requirements to sustain the above on an on-going basis, including an automated system for maintaining the inventory, public access via website, process for public nomination of resources, etc. (October 2011 – April 2012).
- Designate interim responsibility for maintaining the inventory (March 2011).
- Apply for grants and funding to achieve the above and future programs (June 2011 and on-going).

These recommendations are discussed in more detail, below.

## **2.0.0 CURRENT ENVIRONMENT**

### **2.1.0 Local Ordinances and Designations**

Despite the abundance of historical and architectural resources, the Town of Cazenovia has lacked specific focus on and responsibility for the identification and protection of such resources. There is no ordinance specific to such resources, by age, type, or classes. There are no Town-designated, official local landmarks. There are no preferred design standards to guide restoration or new development.

During the 1980's, the Cazenovia Preservation Foundation (CPF) took the lead in encouraging home owners to have homes listed on the State and National Registers, with a resulting twenty-eight properties in the Town awarded the distinction. CPF also developed year-built signs (ex., "ca. 1835") for home owners in the Village and Town to post on their houses. CPF's increased focus and success in agricultural and open space preservation, however, has lessened its formerly predominant role in historical protection, and while it remains a concerned and active proponent, it is not an appointed agency of the Town. As such, it has no formal authority in such matters.

There are no other unofficial markers of a local historical society, neighborhood, or other local organization.

### **2.2.0 State Designations and Programs**

#### **2.2.1 State/National Register of Historic Places**

Despite popular belief, properties that are listed on Registers of Historic Places are not protected. The designation is honorific only and there are no restrictions placed on owners. It is simply the official list of properties designated as significant in our country's history and

worthy of preservation. The designation ensures only that if such a property is threatened by an action of a State or Federal government, that the Historic Preservation Office can intervene to provide consultative and technical assistance. Typically, it is the individual property owner who applies to become listed, a process that can take 12-18 months.

Owners of income producing properties (ie., non-residential) listed on the Register may be eligible for a 20% federal income tax credit for substantial rehabilitation of historic properties. Individuals owning residences may apply for a tax credit if located in certain census tracts. Income producing barns are eligible if placed into service prior to 1936. Municipal and not-for-profit owners of listed historic properties may apply for matching State historic preservation grants.

### 2.2.2 State/Local Landmarks and Preservation Program

Separate from the Register Program is the Local Preservation Program, whereby a community establishes an ordinance which outlines the criteria and process for protection of historical resources. Resources (properties) are not “added” to a list; the ordinance would, in essence, create a local land use technique distinct from zoning law, similar to an overlay “district” that may or may not encompass a prescribed geographic area.

### 2.2.3 Certified Local Governments (CLG’s)

The Certified Local Government Program was established in 1980 as a nation-wide initiative, administered thru the State Preservation Offices. CLG’s support and strengthen local preservation activities by assisting communities to achieve their preservation goals thru the development of an action plan. It is the vehicle by which the State provides funding, staff resources, and programs for preservation to municipalities.

In order for a municipality to be certified, it must have and enforce local legislation for the designation and protection of historic properties; establish and maintain a historic preservation review commission with specific powers; allow for adequate public participation; and, maintain a system for the survey and inventory of historic properties that is in compliance with SHPO standards.

### **2.3.0 Direction from the Comprehensive Plan**

The first goal in Section III of the *Comprehensive Plan of the Village and Town of Cazenovia* (page 128) calls for the creation of an inventory of all natural, scenic, cultural, and historic resources of significance to the Cazenovia community. Three of its five Action Steps have been satisfied for the Town thru this project. The second goal calls for the development of strategies for protecting and enhancing such resources.

#### **2.4.0 Neighboring Communities**

Neighboring communities have undertaken various steps in providing for the identification, recognition, and/or protection of their resources. For example, historic preservation ordinances exist in Auburn, Fayetteville, Hamilton, Cortland, Cooperstown, Skaneateles, Syracuse, and Utica. Literally hundreds of New York communities have enacted ordinances since the 1970's.

Fayetteville, Morrisville, and Syracuse are among over 75 communities in New York State that have received CLG status.

The Village of Cazenovia has a Historic District that is a preservation overlay district. It also has a Historic Preservation and Architectural Advisory Committee which, while an appointed committee of the Village, has advisory rights only and no authority over design or proposed alterations. There is a separate National Register Historic District that overlaps, in part, with the Village Historic District. The Village has indicated its desire to undertake an inventory, though efforts are still in the preliminary stages.

#### **3.0.0 SCOPE OF WORK AND METHODOLOGY EMPLOYED**

Attachment A provides the scope of work approved by the Town Board in August 2010, as well as a description of how the work was undertaken, and criteria for recommendation. In brief, all buildings, structures, and objects greater than fifty years of age were open to consideration (in keeping with State criteria).

This was a *reconnaissance* survey as opposed to an *in-depth* survey. Documentation and research was limited to that which was readily available or known. For New Woodstock, a previous book on its historic homes provided provenance for many of its properties. At the same time, the survey was *comprehensive*; virtually all resources over fifty years of age were included. Landscapes and viewsheds were excluded at the request of the Board (some having already been identified within the Comprehensive Plan).

Outreach to the public was made thru three letters to the local newspaper, the *Cazenovia Republican*; an article in the *Post Standard*; creation of a bi-weekly column in the *Republican*; a flyer to hand out to residents; and presentation to the Rotary Club. Status reports were provided monthly to the Town Board.

#### **4.0.0 RESULTS – RECOMMENDED RESOURCES**

Per State guidelines, any property over fifty years is eligible for historic designation. The time period subject to the project, therefore, was 1790 – 1960. The following describes the end result of the process undertaken over the past several months:

Of this total, the Recommended Resources break down as follows:

37 Sites (where the location itself possesses historical, cultural, or archaeological value regardless of the value of any existing structure)

3 Objects (eg., water troughs, cauldron)

8 Cemeteries

Of the above, 131 (32%) are in New Woodstock, and 273 (68%) are in the balance of the Town. They range from an abandoned 19<sup>th</sup> century school house to a post-modern estate, from a hops barn to a Church, from a tannery factory to an unmodified ranch house. They also include watering troughs, a cauldron, and railroad sites.

Cazenovia is relatively young when compared to historical communities of the eastern states. Having been settled after the Revolution and near the turn of the 18<sup>th</sup> century, it has less Colonial and Federal era construction. The bulk of its oldest properties are 19<sup>th</sup> century.

### **5.0.0 RECOMMENDATIONS & RATIONALE**

It is important *not* to jump to a conclusion that all 404 Recommended Resources are candidates subject to preservation law. First and foremost, this is an inventory of resources contributing to Cazenovia's history. For certain resources, identification and appropriate recognition are potentially sufficient outcomes. With this in mind, the following are recommended actions. All of the recommendations appear technically, operationally, and financially feasible.

**5.1.0 Undertake additional phases of analysis of the inventory with the State Historical Preservation Office** to: (a) validate recommended properties; (b) identify and prioritize in-depth research on recommended resources; (c) identify recognition and protection programs; and (d) to identify candidates for Register nominations by property owners (first phase: **February – May 2011**).

While a community can define what it feels is significant to its history, input from the State as to historical and architectural significance would be beneficial. As noted above, this was a reconnaissance survey, with no attempt made at in-depth research of deeds, etc. that was not already available. With over 400 Recommended Resources, undertaking such in-depth research could take years. Recommendations as to the prioritization and focus of that research are highly desired.

<sup>1</sup> The Tax Map provided by Madison County often denotes the date of last approved construction, rather than the date first constructed; such properties will require additional research for accurate dating. Also, some properties were not listed, while others were listed multiple times. Commercial properties also were not listed and were added separately by the team.

Additionally, there are situations where the experience of other communities and the State would be helpful in determining how best to recognize or treat such resources; for examples:

- A number of properties – particularly in New Woodstock, but also elsewhere in the Town – have lost architectural integrity but are integral to the history of the settlement.
- There are locally important sites where the original structure no longer exists (factories, railroad, first fishing camps, etc).
- Architecturally significant properties exist whose owners were not necessarily significant to the history of the community.

Options range from documentation in a booklet to a local landmarks program to a protection thru a local preservation program. Incentives to homeowners – from free event tickets to tax credits – are another area that can be pursued.

Refining the criteria, validating the Recommended Resources, as well as determining the best approach for dealing with the above situations would be undertaken over the next four months, with recommendations to the Town Board. During this time, interested owners whose properties may meet Register criteria could be provided with information on the application process. Additionally, the 97 properties not seen would be surveyed for consideration.

### **5.2.0 Engage with the SHPO to draft an ordinance relating to the protection of architecturally significant resources and/or historically significant resources (May – October 2011).**

Just because a resource is old does not mean that it must be protected. The community must define what it feels to be its landmarks or districts of historical, architectural, and cultural significance. It does so through the documentation and establishment of a preservation ordinance.

A preservation ordinance typically does not:

- Require improvements, changes, or restoration of a property;
- Require approvals of interior changes or alterations;
- Restrict the sale of the property;
- Prevent new construction within historic areas;
- Require that historical properties be open for tours;
- Require approval for ordinary repairs or maintenance;
- Stop future development.

What it can do is:

- Provide a policy for the protection of historical properties;
- Establish an objective and democratic process for designating historic properties;
- Protect the integrity of designated historic properties within a design review requirement;
- Authorize design guidelines for new development or renovation within historic districts to ensure that it is not destructive to the area's historic character;
- Guide new development;
- Stabilize and improve property values.

Additional goals of a preservation ordinance would be to foster civic pride in Cazenovia's legacy of both historical achievements and aesthetic beauty; protect and enhance attraction of tourists and visitors, thereby strengthening and developing the local economy; and, promote the use of its significant resources for the education, pleasure, and welfare of its citizens.

While preservation ordinances have appeared throughout the country since 1931, they began to increase, albeit somewhat slowly, after the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966. This Act aimed to preserve historical sites in the United States and created the State Historical Preservation Offices along with the Registers of Historic Places and National Landmarks.

Further impetus was provided in 1967 when New York City's Landmarks Preservation Commission designated the Grand Central Railroad Station as a landmark protected by law. After a ten year legal battle by developers, the Supreme Court of the United States ruled that a local government may enact a land use restriction to preserve the "character and desirable aesthetic features of a city," because it "enhances the quality of life." Following that decision, communities having ordinances increased dramatically, with communities promoting protection as a way to ensure their viability and desired character.

Cazenovia has been late to recognize and utilize this tool. The need for protection of significant resources became apparent in reviewing the inventory. Some resources have lost all integrity, while others are severely threatened. Within the Town, Owers Point and Thornfield were unnecessarily destroyed. Currently, the Enders Property – considered by many as the gateway to the community -- is threatened by demolition. That New Woodstock has numerous Sites – as opposed to actual Buildings – speaks to demolition or insensitive renovations that have occurred over the years. Other New Woodstock properties are threatened by further loss of architectural integrity that if not arrested, will destroy the very character the community takes now pride in.

Equally important, the lack of such an ordinance prevents the Town from taking advantage of State funds and programs, and other foundation grants that otherwise could be available for capital and expense funding.

The reviews with State representatives will provide input to alternative content of an ordinance for the Town's review, as well as complementary and alternative programs as described above.

### **5.3.0 Work with the SHPO to complete all requirements necessary to become a Certified Local Government (March – November 2011).**

Becoming a CLG provides access to both funds and programs. Many communities complete their surveys and inventories by a grant from the State. Concurrent with the above, the State can work with the Town to prepare an application. Two pre-requisites of the CLG are having a local Historic Preservation Ordinance and Commission. SHPO is willing to work with the Town concurrently, however, to develop its application.

As two separate municipalities, both the Village and Town would need to apply for CLG certification. However, consideration could and should be given to having an inter-municipal Historic Preservation Commission. This would ensure consistency in treatment between the two governments, for both residents and developers.

It can be noted that much of the expense and work of the current project team could have been funded by the State, had the Town been a CLG. Similarly, funding to explore alternatives of the Gothic Cottage is the type of project often funded by SHPO. The Town is missing opportunities to bolster its financial support of such initiatives.

### **5.4.0 Apply for an intern in 2012 to assist in the above research and documentation phases** (The 2011 applications are due February 11th).

Inquiry was made with Colgate University's Upstate Institute. There is considerable competition among communities for this free resource. It was noted, however, that Cazenovia had not ever participated and might be viewed more favorably. Timing of the application process at Colgate unfortunately disallows consideration for 2011.

Cornell University also has an intern program to assist in the documentation and research. It is recommended that internships be pursued for 2012 once the above prioritized areas are defined.

**5.5.0 Further identify and undertake requirements to sustain the above on an on-going basis, including an automated system for maintaining the inventory, public access via website, process for public nomination of resources, etc. (October 2011 – April 2012).**

It became clear early on that automation is required to document and archive the inventory and digital photographs. New York State does not have or provide any historical resource software to its communities. The team briefly explored what software was available and used by other communities.

One system, known as CHRID ([www.chridnet.com](http://www.chridnet.com)) is a system developed by three CLG's in the State of California that is **free** to any community for on-site installation. It can be hosted offsite for a fee beginning at \$43/month. The Town of Wethersfield CT contracted with a vendor to develop its own system; as a Certified Local Government, Wethersfield received funding for the system from its State Historic Preservation Office. The latter's approach to its inventory project and resultant outcome is very similar to Cazenovia's [<http://hpi.wethersfieldct.com/index.cgi/472>]. New York is supposedly working on a system with SUNY- New Paltz, however, no sample could be obtained and availability may be years away. On an operational basis, some nominal funding for systems acquisition and maintenance will be required.

In the interim, the team converted the State's data collection sheet to an electronic form. Results were then documented on a spreadsheet. Digital and hard copy images of the resources were submitted. Additionally, an effort is underway to develop Google maps of Recommended Resources utilizing GPS coordinates. (see Attachment B as an example). This mapping will continue for the next several months, however, over 300 images have been loaded to date.

The Town could use the Google maps also as a way for the public to access the data, or as a link off the Town website. It may be of use to the Planning Board/ZBA in reviewing proposed projects. Ultimately, it could link to whatever inventory system is deployed.

It is recommended that detailed requirements and pricing of alternatives be obtained in the upcoming months.

**5.6.0 Designate interim responsibility for maintaining the inventory (March 2011).**

It is recommended that until such time as a Historic Commission is established, that the Town of Cazenovia Historian maintain physical possession of the inventory notebooks and data files.

**5.7.0 Apply for grants and funding to achieve the above and future programs (June 2011 and on-going).**

There are various grants available from the NY Preservation League, private foundations, as well as the State. Such grants could go toward undertaking required research, community education and outreach, computer systems support, and/or marketing.

### **6.0.0 OPPORTUNITIES**

Documenting and protecting the historic, architectural, and cultural resources has a direct impact on ensuring that the character of Cazenovia will survive. It also provides opportunities to support the local economy by attracting visitors and community involvement in related events. Numerous studies have validated the positive impact that preservation has in generating revenue and enhancing property values. One need only visit Charleston SC, Burlington VT, or Pittsford NY to see the vitality of a community that has demonstrably embraced its heritage.

Several of the ideas that emerged:

- New Woodstock and Cazenovia were actively involved in the Abolitionist movement. Potential exists for inclusion in the State's *Abolitionist Trail* and related promotional marketing.
- The Town's properties represent a remarkable breadth of architectural styles and movements. Architectural tours and publications, similar to that developed by Hamilton, are feasible.
- The history of Cazenovia and selected citizens exist in a few books, with much undocumented. A concerted effort should be made to document the families and development of the community. With no promotion, genealogy tourists already visit the area, using local restaurants and lodgings. With additional research, documentation, and Internet access to historical records, this could become a meaningful tourism draw.
- New Woodstock celebrates a "Historic Homes Day." This could be undertaken with the entire Town and in conjunction with the Village. Timing it with Historic Preservation Month would leverage efforts and coincide with public presentations.
- School programs and public education programs could be developed to enhance a sense of community and pride.
- Designated protection would provide clear guidelines to residents and developers as to how to protect our historic structures while encouraging growth. Design guidelines and/or standards would provide direction to developers and improve efficiency in the review process.

### **7.0.0 APPROVAL**

Much of what is defined as the distinct "character" of Cazenovia is intangible; however, much of what is intangible is derived from Cazenovia's very tangible assets — its architecture and properties relating to the history and settlement of Cazenovia. These tangible assets define Cazenovia's intangible character. Attractive, historic communities have retained their character not by accident nor by wishful thinking; they result from sound municipal planning and local historic preservation legislation.

Approval of these recommendations is requested to protect this character and the legacy of Cazenovia's ancestors, a legacy that has been entrusted to our care for future generations.

## **Attachment A: Scope, Methodology, Criteria, Definitions**

### **Scope Document Historic and Architectural Resources Inventory Project Town of Cazenovia**

**Purpose:** To identify those properties of current and potential historical and/or architectural significance in the Town of Cazenovia.

**Scope:** This project will prepare a physical inventory of such properties. As used within this project, a historic resource or historic property shall be defined as stated within the New York State Historic Preservation guidelines: “Any building, structure, district, landscape, area, site or object ... that is of significance in the history, architecture, archeology, or culture of the state, its communities, or the nation.” An inventory of natural resources (rivers, forests, aquifers, mountains, etc.) and view sheds is excluded from this project, except where they may have historical significance as defined above.

This inventory will include (a) all properties in the Town (excluding the Village) that have been listed in the State and National Registers of Historic Places; (b) any locally designated properties; and (c) properties identified by the Committee as having historical significance but which may not have any governmental or agency designation.

The inventory shall be documented with content and format as found within the SHPO Guidelines, including photographs. Where necessary, additional rationale may be provided and documented. If feasible, GPS coordinates will be included.

This project does not include developing a definition of Town protection or preservation of such properties; or defining any legislation, policies, processes that would utilize this inventory in the future.

**Approach:** A core team comprised of individuals having a demonstrated competence, knowledge, or interest in history, historical preservation, architecture, and cultural arts will undertake the inventory. Additional individuals and specialists may be called upon to act as Advisory members to provide ad hoc guidance or opinion.

**Targeted Completion:** January 2011

## Methodology

Individual Team Leaders were responsible for identifying potential resources within New Woodstock, the balance of the Town, and from any Register properties and Local Landmarks. The Town was further divided into sections and assigned to team members to identify, photograph, and if possible, provide additional information on candidate properties over 50 years of age.

The application for State and National Register properties was converted into an electronic form with three fields added unique to Cazenovia. Identifiers per team member were assigned to each resource. The resource was then presented to an Advisory Board made up of five subject matter experts. The Advisory Board determined that the resource should be recommended as “significant”; not recommended’ or as requiring further research before any disposition could be made. Where there was not unanimous consensus, majority rule prevailed.

It is important to note that the Recommended Resources are not team member recommendations but those of the Advisory Board members. Any property overlooked or not available to Team members can be submitted for (re-)consideration once an on-going process is in place.

Recommended Resources were each assigned a unique inventory number, added to the spreadsheet, application/data sheet, and ultimately, will be added to the Google maps.

## Criteria

### Historic and Architectural Significance & Integrity

Significance: 4 Criteria:

The resource:

- Is associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of Cazenovia’s history;
- Is associated with the lives of person’s significant in Cazenovia’s past;
- Embodies the distinctive characteristics of a type, period, or method of construction; or that represent the works of a master; or that possesses high artistic values; or that represents a significant and distinguishable entity whose components may lack individual distinction; or,

- Has yielded, or may be likely to yield, information important in prehistory or history.

Integrity: Seven aspects or qualities define integrity:

- Location
- Setting
- Design
- Materials
- Workmanship
- Feeling (expression of the property's aesthetic or historic sense of a particular period of time)
- Association (link to an important event or person)

Exclusions: Properties less than 50 years. Religious, relocated, birthplaces, graves, cemeteries, commemorative properties, however, allowed if there is historic or architectural basis.

## Definitions

*Cultural Resource:*

*“Any building, structure, district..., site, or object...that is of significance in the history, architecture, archeology, or culture of the state, its communities, or the nation.”*

Building

A *building*, such as a house, barn, church, hotel, or similar construction, is created principally to shelter any form of human activity. *Building* may also be used to refer to a historically and functionally related unit, such as a courthouse and jail, or a house and barn.

**Caz Examples:** *Schoolhouses, hop barns*

Site

A *site* is the location of a significant event, a prehistoric or historical occupation or activity, or of a building or structure, whether standing, ruined, or vanished, where the location itself possesses historical, cultural, or archaeological value regardless of the value of any existing structure.

**Caz Examples:** *first campsite in New Woodstock; Green St. Parade Ground; Cemeteries; New Woodstock WPA forested area; Caz Train roundhouse @ Rtes 92/20; Sites of Railroad Beds??*

Structure

The term *structure* is used to distinguish from *buildings* those functional constructions made usually for purposes other than creating human shelter. Examples include bridges, tunnels, dams, railroad grades, railroad cars, roadways, grain elevators, windmills, railroad and trolley cars, and earthworks.

**Caz Examples:** *Railroad tunnels; Chittenango creek bridges; Turnstile in New Woodstock; waterwheel in New Woodstock.*

**Industrial remains:** *Cedar Grove, Bingley, Belmont powder keg factory*


